Step 1: Choose Your Course

Step 2: Apply

Apply online at **www.windsor.ac.uk** You shall receive an email to confirm we have received your application.

Step 3: Attend Your Interview

You will be invited to book an interview, where you will discuss your course choice and plans for the future. This will also give you the opportunity to ask any questions you may have too.

Step 4: Offer

Following a successful interview, you shall be made a conditional offer via email.

Please note: This can take up to 14 days. To accept your conditional offer, please log back into your Student Portal. You need to accept your offer to receive your invitation to enrolment.

Step 5: Enrol

You will be sent instructions on how to enrol onto your course the summer before you start with us.

Step 6: Get Your Results

You will need your exam results to be able to enrol onto your chosen course. If your results are better than expected or you didn't do as well as you'd hoped, we can find a suitable alternative.

Step 7: Start College

We look forward to welcoming you in September!

Study Programme

If you're aged 16–19, you will follow a study programme to help you develop academically, practically and personally.

Study programmes are designed to meet students' individual learning needs and includes all the elements that make up their individual timetable at the College. We want you to be confident and ready to meet the demands of learning, work and life.

Our students typically study three A Levels, a full or mixed vocational programme equivalent to three A Levels or a T-Level. Level 2 students will complete a programme consisting of vocational courses alongside GCSE English, maths and/or science.



Choose the Right Course & Level for You

A Minimum of Five GCSEs Grade 4 & Above

Including English and maths. You must also meet the specific subject entry requirements.

Your Options at Windsor:

A Level Programme: Two year study programme of three A Levels.

Mixed Programme:

Two year study programme of A Levels and Level 3 vocational course or Industry ready study programme.

Your Progression After College:

University, 'degree' apprenticeships or employment.

A Minimum of Four GCSEs Grade 4 & Above

Including English and maths. You must also meet the specific subject entry requirements.

Your Options at Windsor:

Level 3 vocational course in any combination for two years.

Your Progression After College:

University, 'degree' apprenticeships or employment.

Less than Four GCSEs

Minimum of three grade 3s and one grade 2 including English or maths at grade 3.

Your Options at Windsor:

Level 2 vocational course including English and/or maths for one year.

A Level Programme: Two year study programme of three A Levels.

T Level: Two-year Industry Ready study programme

Apprenticeship: Level 3 programmes in Stage, Screen and Design Industry. 80% on-the-job training and 20% classroom based.

T-LEVELS

THE NEXT LEVEL QUALIFICATION

T Levels are qualifications for students aged 16 to 19 living in England who have finished their GCSEs.

T Levels have been designed in collaboration with employers and businesses, so that you will learn everything you need to prepare for the workplace.

They offer you more practical work experience and industry placement hours as part of your education than any other qualification currently available, except for apprenticeships.

Each T Level is equivalent to 3 A levels and helps you to develop the knowledge, attitude and practical skills to thrive in either the workplace or progress to further study.

T Level students spend 80% of the course in the classroom, learning the essential skills that employers need. The other 20% is a meaningful industry placement, where they put these skills into action. The industry placement will be 3 months in total, a minimum of 45 days (315 hours over the duration of the course). The industry placement should be with a maximum of 2 employers. You will get valuable experience in the workplace: employers get early sight of the new talent in their industry.

Within each course, students develop an understanding of a broad range of issues relevant to the sector, as well as topics specific to the course and an occupational specialism.

What are the key differences between T Levels, A Levels and Apprenticeships?

- **T Levels** are designed to offer a path for learners wishing to enter skilled professions or progress to further study. These are typically 80% in the classroom and 20% on an industry placement.
- **Apprenticeships** are for those who wish to learn a specific occupation. These are typically 80% in-the-job and 20% in the classroom. Apprenticeships are more suited to those who know what occupation they want to pursue, are at the working age of 16, and want to earn a wage while learning at the same time.
- **A Levels** are for learners who wish to continue academic education.



Are T Levels included in the UCAS tariff?

UCAS tariff points are allocated to T Levels in the same way they are with A Levels.

UCAS points are only allocated to the **overall T Level grade**. Students must achieved at least an overall pass grade to receive UCAS points.

Qualification (EPQ)

Increase your UCAS points by studying the EPQ (worth half an A Level) – choose a subject you are interested in and demonstrate your independent research skills.

Our students have achieved success in a number of challenges including the Chemistry Olympiad, the UK Senior Maths Challenge, the NSEC (National Schools Employability Challenge) and the Interior Design competitions for the British Display Society.

The programme has achieved a 100% success rate for students receiving offers from Cambridge and Oxford. It utilises the Unifrog platform to empower students in building UCAS statements and accessing valuable information about careers and apprenticeships. The Aspire programme plays a vital role in supporting students' successful progression and ensuring they are well-equipped for their future endeavours.

This **2 year course** requires four GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including English or maths, plus art and may include a BTEC.

Alternatively, Level 2 BTEC art and design at merit or a demonstrable interest in and experience of the subject or a T Level in Craft & Design.

Alternatively, three GCSEs, two at grade 3 and one at grade 2 including English or maths at grade 3, plus a pass in a Level 2 BTEC or OCR First Certificate.

This **2 year course** requires GCSEs in maths at grade 6 and combined science or biology at double grade 6, plus the standard entry requirements of an A Level or mixed programme. See page 11.

A Level Chemistry

This **2 year course** requires GCSEs in maths at grade 6 and combined science or chemistry at double grade 6, plus the standard entry requirements of an A Level or mixed programme. See page 11.

A Level Physics

This **2 year course** requires GCSEs in maths at grade 6 and combined science or physics at double grade 6, plus the standard entry requirements of an A Level or mixed programme. See page 11.

Students are advised to take A Level maths if taking A Level physics.

Level 3 Programme in Applied Science (equivalent to 3 A Levels)

This **2 year course** requires either four GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including maths and combined science at grade 5 in science or a Level 2 BTEC in science at merit.

Level 3 Programme in Applied Science (equivalent to 1 A Level)

This **2 year course** requires four GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including maths and combined science at grade 5 or a Level 2 BTEC science at merit.

Level 2 Programme in Health & Social Care

This 1 year Level 2 course is intended as a pathway to a Level 3 qualification, and require four GCSEs, three at Grade 3 and one at Grade 2 which must include GCSE English or maths at Grade 3 and GCSE science at Grade 3.

Level 3 Programme in Health & Social Care

This 2 year course requires four GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including English and science or a Level 2 BTEC in science at merit, plus Level 2 BTEC in health and social care at merit if taken.

GCSE Pathway



Getting a good pass in English and maths GCSE is important for your future progression and career.

The government now requires every student without a grade 4 or above to continue with these subjects until 18. At our Colleges you will have expert post-16 support to develop your potential and increase your current grade.

These two GCSEs are studied alongside a Level 2 BTEC qualification. You may have the opportunity to study English or maths alongside a Level 3 programme if you have not achieved a grade 4.

GCSE Mathematics

This **1 year course** is vital for your future progression. This is a great way to improve your current grade.

GCSE English
